An Excerpt from Luther's Writings

"This is the first petition. For by honoring God we bring Him the first and the last and the highest offering within our power; nor does He seek and ask for more. Moreover, we cannot give God anything else, for it is He Who gives us everything else. But He does claim for Himself this honor, namely, that we acknowledge and witness in our words and songs, our lives and deeds, in all that we do and suffer, that everything is of God, in support of Psalm 111, "Full of honor and majesty is His work, and His righteousness endures forever." That is to say, the deeds of him in whom God lives and works do nothing else but accord God great honor and glory and ascribe all to Him....In that respect he is just, giving to God what is God's and to himself what is his, to God honor and everything else, to himself dishonor and nothing else. That is the justice that endures forever for it appeals not only to man here in timesuch as the lamps of the foolish virgins and the righteousness of sham saints-but also to the eternal God, with Whom justice abides forever." From "An Exposition of the Lord's Prayer for Simple Laymen," 1519.
