#### **A Prayer before Communion**

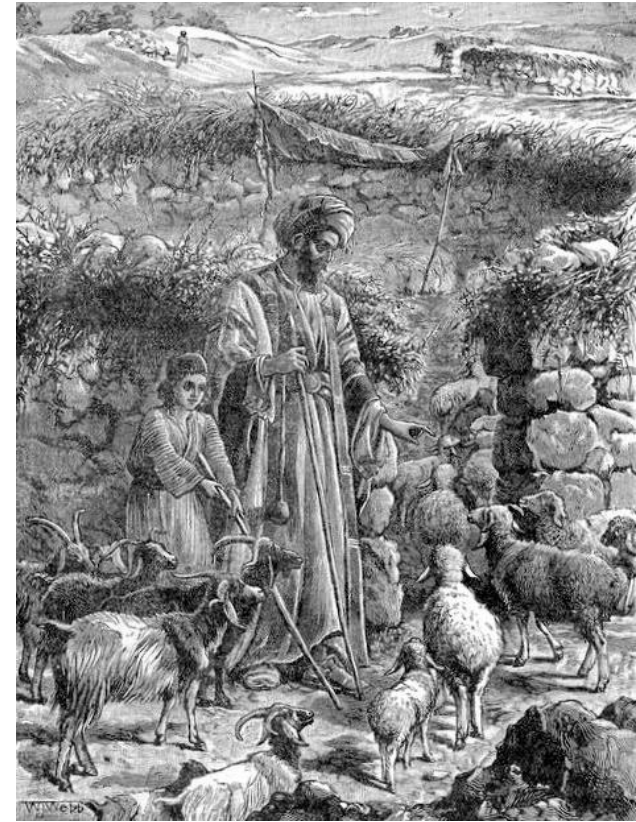

For we must constantly see and hear the maliciousness which Satan and the world practice against the Gospel. There is so much misery upon Earth that we ought to be tired of this life and cry aloud, 'Come, dear Lord, and deliver us.'" *From the Church Postil for the Twenty-Sixth Sunday after Trinity Sunday.*
