A Prayer before Communion

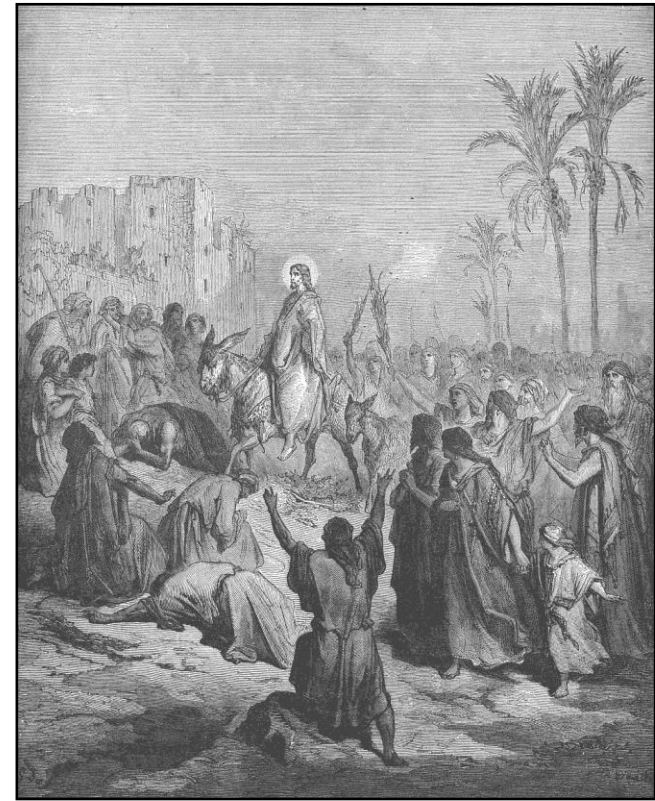
