The Pastor would be glad to make an appointment with anyone to discuss our teachings and/or our parish.


## A Prayer after Communion

1. Built on the Rock the Church doth stand, Even when steeples are falling; Crumbled have spires in ev'ry land, Bells still are chiming and calling, Calling the young and old to rest, But above all the soul distrest, Longing for rest everlasting.

- 2. Surely in temples made with hands, God, the Most High, is not dwelling; High above Earth His temple stands, All earthly temples excelling. Yet He Whom heav'ns cannot contain Chose to abide on Earth with men, Built in our bodies His temple.
- 3. We are God's house of living stones, Builded for His habitation; He through baptismal grace us owns Heirs of His wondrous salvation. Were we but two His Name to tell, Yet He would deign with us to dwell, With all His grace and His favor.
