For this reason He became our king and came down to us that He might deliver us from these tyrants and rule over us Himself alone. Therefore he who is under this King cannot be harmed either by sin, death, hell, Satan, man or any other creature. As his King lives without sin and is blessed, so must he be kept forever without sin and death in living blessedness." *From Martin Luther's Sermon from the Church Postil of 1521*.






