For if I should see heaven standing open and could merit it by picking up a straw, I would not do it, lest I might say: Behold, I have earned it! No, no, not to my deserving, but to God be the glory, who has given me His Son to abolish sin and Hell for me." *From Martin Luther's sermon from the Church Postil for the Ninth Sunday after Trinity Sunday.*




