We also welcome the members who are in good standing of any of the parishes served by the Bishop, Pastors, and Deacons of The Evangelical Lutheran Diocese of North America (ELDoNA), and who have spoken to the Pastor prior to the service. Members of other Lutheran parishes or other denominations are kindly asked to refrain from communing today. The Pastor would be glad to make an appointment with anyone to discuss our teachings and/or our parish.


### A Prayer after Communion

Nor did Christ spare His Apostles, but earnestly admonished them, when He said in Luke 21:34-36: 'Take heed to yourselves, lest haply your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life,' which, he shows, will be most prevalent at the end of the world, 'and that day come on you suddenly as a snare; but watch ye at every season, making supplication, that ye may prevail to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man."
