Members of other Lutheran parishes or other denominations are kindly asked to refrain from communing today. The Pastor would be glad to make an appointment with anyone to discuss our teachings and/or our parish.

A Prayer before Communion



But here you see no works at all, no merit, here there is neither command nor law; there is nothing more than the offering of Christ's assistance, His comfort and His grace, only kindness meets the man sick of the palsy."
