Members of other Lutheran parishes or other denominations are kindly asked to refrain from communing today. The Pastor would be glad to make an appointment with anyone to discuss our teachings and/or our parish.

"But what happens in heaven concerning this birth? As much as it is despised on earth, so much and a thousand times more is it honoured in heaven. If an angel from heaven came and praised you and your work,

would you not regard it of greater value than all the praise and honour the world could give you, and for which you would be willing to bear the greatest humility and reproach? What exalted honour is that when all the angels in heaven can not restrain themselves from breaking out in rejoicing, so that even poor shepherds in the fields hear them preach, praise God, sing and pour out their joy without measure? Were not all joy and honour realized at Bethlehem, yes, all joy and honour experienced by all the kings and nobles on earth, to be regarded as only dross and abomination, of which no one likes to think, when compared with the joy and glory here displayed?" A sermon by Martin Luther, from his Wartburg Church Postil, 1521-1522.
