#### A Prayer before Communion



## An Excerpt from Luther's Writings

"What are those wonderful things spoken concerning Him? They are the things concerning which St. Simeon had spoken immediately before, when in the temple he took the child Jesus upon his arms, saying: 'Now lettest thou thy servant depart, Lord according to thy word, in peace; for mine eyes have seen thy salvation, which thou hast prepared before the face of all peoples; a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel.' At these things, St. Luke says, they marveled, namely, that this aged and holy man stood there before them in the temple, took the child in his arms and spoke of Him so exultingly, calling Him the light of the world, a Saviour of all nations, a glory of all the people of Israel;

Simeon himself thinking so highly of Him that he would now fain depart this life after he had seen the child." *From the Church Postil for the First Sunday after Christmas*, 1522.
