An Excerpt from Luther's Writings

"Christ manifests Himself thus on our account that we might know Him aright, and believe Him to be not only true man, but also true God. When the mother asks Him: 'Son, why hast Thou thus dealt with us?' He defends Himself and says: 'I did not disobey you, nor did I disregard your will as you seem to think.' He claims to have acted aright and to deserve no reprimand from His mother. Mary and Joseph had to learn that their sorrow and anxiety were wrong. They should have remembered what the angels, the shepherds, the old man Simeon, and others had spoken concerning this Child, then they would have known that, although He tarried behind, it was no act of disobedience, since He owed greater obedience to His Father in heaven than to His mother on earth." *From the House Postil for the First Sunday after Epiphany, 1522.*
