
#### **Collect for Judica**

### **1 Corinthians 1:21-31**

<sup>21</sup> For seeing that in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom knew not God, it was God's good pleasure through the foolishness of the preaching to save them that believe. <sup>22</sup> Seeing that Jews ask for signs, and Greeks seek after wisdom: <sup>23</sup> but we preach Christ crucified, unto Jews stumblingblock, and unto Gentiles foolishness; <sup>24</sup> but unto them that are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God, and the wisdom of God. 25 Because the foolishness of God is wiser than men: and the weakness of God is stronger than men. <sup>26</sup> For behold your calling, brethren, that not many wise after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called: <sup>27</sup> but God chose the foolish things of the world, that He might put to shame them that are wise; and God chose the weak things of the world, that He might put to shame the things that are strong; <sup>28</sup> and the base things of the world, and the things that are despised, did God choose, yea and the things that are not, that He might bring to nought the things that are: <sup>29</sup> that no flesh should glory before God. <sup>30</sup> But of Him are ye in Christ Jesus, who was made unto us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification, and redemption: <sup>31</sup> that, according as it is written, "He that glorieth, let him glory in the Lord."
