Easter Vigil Service


The Service of Light

Candles are distributed to all, later to be lighted from the Paschal Candle.



opposed to feeling. Therefore the author of the Epistle to the Hebrews writes of faith: ‘Now faith is assurance of things hoped for, a conviction of things not seen.’ For if we would see Christ visibly in heaven, like the visible sun, we would not need to believe it. But since Christ died for our sins and was raised for our justification, we cannot see it nor feel it, neither can we comprehend it with our reason. Therefore we must disregard our feeling and accept only the Word, write it into our heart and cling to it, even though it seems as if my sins were not taken from me, and even though I still feel them within me. Our feelings must not be considered, but we must constantly insist that death, sin and hell have been conquered, although I feel that I am still under the power of death, sin and hell. For although we feel that sin is still in us, it is only permitted that our faith may be developed and strengthened, that in spite of all our feelings we accept the Word, and that we unite our hearts and consciences more and more to Christ. Thus faith leads us quietly, contrary to all feeling and comprehension of reason, through sin, through death and through hell. Then we shall see salvation before our eyes, and then we shall know perfectly what we have believed, namely, that death and all sorrow have been conquered.” *From Martin Luther’s Sermon in the Church Postil for Easter from the mid-1520s.*

The Celebrant traces the vertical line of the cross with a stylus, while saying:

V: Christ yesterday and today,

He traces the transept of the cross, saying:

V: The beginning and the end.

He traces the Greek letter Alpha at the top of the cross, saying:

V: The Alpha

He traces the Greek letter Omega at the bottom of the cross, saying:

V: And Omega.

He traces the first number of the year upon the Candle in the upper left corner of the cross, saying:

V: His are the seasons

He traces the second number of the year upon the Candle in the upper right corner of the cross, saying:

V: His the ages;

He traces the third number of the year upon the Candle in the lower left corner of the cross, saying:

V: To Him be glory and dominion,

He traces the last number of the year upon the Candle in the lower right corner of the cross, saying:

V: Through ages eternal.

The Celebrant place five wax nails in the extremities of the cross, and the center, representing the wounds of our Lord, in the following order:

Top of the cross, center of the cross, bottom of the cross, left transept of the cross, right transept of the cross, saying:

V: By His wounds, holy (*nail one*)

V: And innocent, (*nail two*)

V: May He save us (*nail three*)

V: And redeem us (*nail four*)

V: Who is Christ the Lord. Amen. (*nail five*)

Then receiving an unlit candle, he lights it from the fire, and then lights the Paschal Candle with this newly lit Candle, saying:

V: Christ rises triumphant, may His light dispel from hearts and minds the darkness of this evil world!

The Salutation

Then the Celebrant chants the Salutation:



V: The Lord be with you.

The Congregation responds, chanting:

R: And with thy spi - rit.

The Collect

The Celebrant chants the Collect:

Let us pray. We beseech Thee, Almighty God, pour forth Thy abundant blessing upon this Thy people, and fill this night with the splendor of the Light of the world, Thy dear Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. May the Candle we offer tonight shine more brightly through the secret addition of Thine own radiance. And wherever Thy Word and Sacrament shall be carried, may the evil of Satan's guile be driven thence, and the power of Thy majestic glory made manifest; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord.

The Congregation responds, chanting:

The Procession

The Procession proceeds in silence and in complete darkness, except for the light of the Paschal Candle. This represents the sojourn of the Israelites out of Egypt who followed the pillar of fire by night.

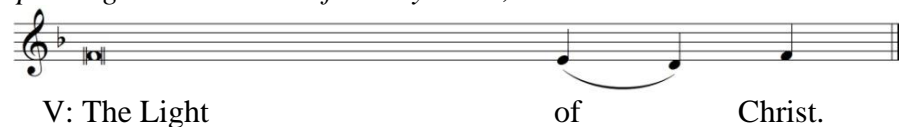

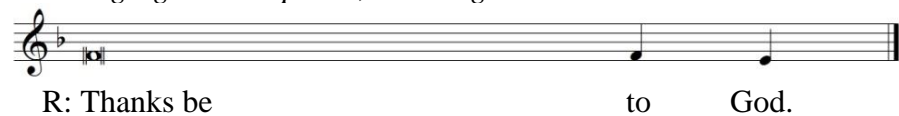

At the entrance to the Nave, the Candle bearer stops, raises the Candle up as high as he can comfortably do so, and a minister chants:

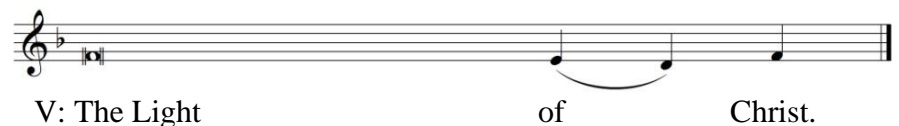

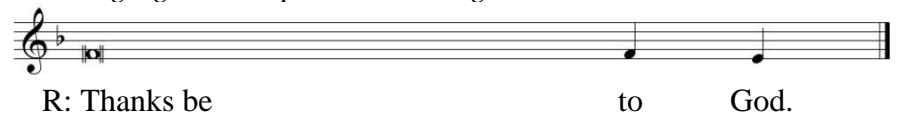

When the Candle bearer reaches the middle of the Nave, he stops, raises the Candle up as high as he can comfortably do so, and a minister chants:

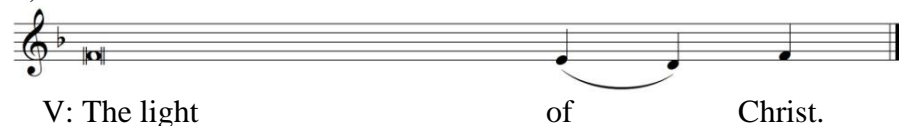

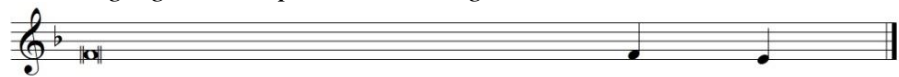


The other Ministers light their Candles from the Celebrant's Candle.

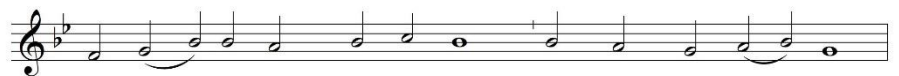
Everyone else lights their Candles.

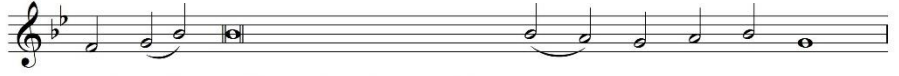





The Celebrant reads the Twelve Prophecies standing before the Paschal Candle (If a shorter Service of Reading is desired only readings I, II, IV, V, VII, and XII may be used):

I. Genesis 1:1—3:24

A reading from the First through Third chapters of the First Book of Moses, commonly called Genesis, beginning at the First verse:

¹:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. ² And the earth was waste and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep: and the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. ³ And God said, "Let there be light:" and there was light. ⁴ And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness. ⁵ And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, one day. ⁶ And God said, "Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters." ⁷ And God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament: and it was so. ⁸ And God called the firmament Heaven. IV. Jonah 1:1—4:11

A reading from the First through the Fourth chapters of the Prophet Jonah, beginning at the First verse:

^{1:1} Now the word of Jehovah came unto Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, ² “Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before Me.” ³ But Jonah rose up to flee unto Tarshish from the presence of Jehovah; and he went down to Joppa, and found a ship going to Tarshish: so he paid the fare thereof, and went down into it, to go with them unto Tarshish from the presence of Jehovah. ⁴ But Jehovah sent out a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship was like to be broken. ⁵ Then the mariners were afraid, and cried every man unto his god; and they cast forth the wares that were in the ship into the sea, to lighten it unto them. 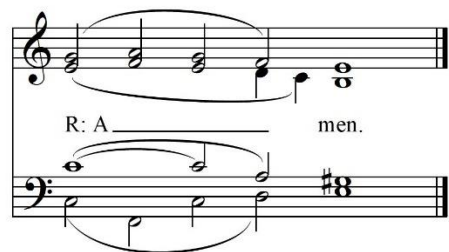

The Service of Holy Baptism

The Celebrant goes to the pulpit and from there calls all to remember their Holy Baptism, saying:

In this most sacred night, my dearly beloved, holy Mother Church commemorates the death and burial of our Lord Jesus Christ. In return for His great love, she lovingly keeps watch with Him. And looking forward to His glorious resurrection, she rejoices with an exceeding joy.

But as the Apostle teaches us, we have by Holy Baptism been buried with Christ into death. As Christ, then, has risen from the dead, so we too must walk now in newness of life. For we know that our Old Adam has been crucified with Christ, that we may no longer be slaves to sin. Let us remember always that we have died to sin, but are alive in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

Therefore, My beloved, having completed the penitential Lenten season, let us now proceed to renew the promises of our Holy Baptism. By these promises we once renounced Satan and all his works, as well as that world which is the enemy of God; we vowed, furthermore, to serve God faithfully in the holy Christian, and apostolic Church.

Salvation is of Jehovah." ¹⁰ And Jehovah spake unto the fish, and it vomited out Jonah upon the dry land.

^{3:1} And the word of Jehovah came unto Jonah the second time, saying, ² "Arise, go unto Nineveh, that great city, and preach unto it the preaching that I bid thee." ³ So Jonah arose, and went unto Nineveh, according to the word of Jehovah. Now Nineveh was an exceeding great city, of three days' journey. ⁴ And Jonah began to enter into the city a day's journey, and he cried, and said, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown." ⁵ And the people of Nineveh believed God; and they proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them even to the least of them. ⁶ And the tidings reached the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, and laid his robe from him, and covered him with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. ⁷ And he made proclamation and published through Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles, saying, "Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything; let them not feed, nor drink water; ⁸ but let them be covered

^{4:1} But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. ² And he prayed unto Jehovah, and said, "I pray thee, O Jehovah, was not this my saying, when I was yet in my country? Therefore I hastened to flee unto Tarshish; for I knew that Thou art a gracious God, and merciful, slow to anger, and abundant in lovingkindness, and repentest Thee of the evil. ³ Therefore now, O Jehovah, take, I beseech Thee, my life from me; for it is better for me to die than to live." ⁴ And Jehovah said, "Doest thou well to be angry?" ⁵ Then Jonah went out of the city, and sat on the east side of the city, and there made him a booth, and sat under it in the shade, till he might see what would become of the city. ⁶ And Jehovah God prepared a gourd, and made it to come up over Jonah, that it might be a shade over his head, to deliver him from his evil case. So Jonah was exceeding glad because of the gourd. ⁷ But God prepared a worm when the morning rose the next day, and it smote the gourd, that it withered. ⁸ And it came to pass, when the sun arose, that God prepared a sultry east wind; and the sun beat upon the head of Jonah, that he fainted, and requested for himself that he might die, and said, "It is better for me to die than to live." ⁹ And God said to Jonah, "Doest thou well to be angry for the gourd?" And he said, "I do well to be angry, even unto death." ¹⁰ And Jehovah said, "Thou hast had regard for the gourd, for which thou hast not labored, neither madest it grow; which came up in a night, and perished in a night: ¹¹ and should not I have regard for Nineveh, that great city, wherein are more than sixscore thousand persons that cannot discern between their right hand and their left hand; and also much cattle?"

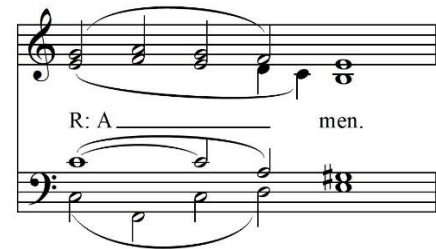

V. Exodus 14:24—15:21

A Reading from the Fourteenth and Fifteenth chapters of the Second Book of Moses, commonly called Exodus, beginning at the Twenty-Fourth verse:

^{14:24} And it came to pass in the morning watch, that Jehovah looked forth upon the host of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and of cloud, and discomfited the host of the Egyptians. ²⁵ And He took off their chariot wheels, and they drove them heavily; so that the Egyptians said, “Let us flee from the face of Israel; for Jehovah fighteth for them against the Egyptians.” ²⁶ And Jehovah said unto Moses, “Stretch out thy hand over the sea, that the waters may come again upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots, and upon their horsemen.” ²⁷ And Moses stretched forth his hand over the sea, and the sea returned to its strength when the morning appeared; and the Egyptians fled against it; and Jehovah overthrew the Egyptians in the midst of the sea. ²⁸ And the waters returned, and covered the chariots, and the horsemen, even all the host of Pharaoh that went in after them into the sea; there remained not so much as one of them. ²⁹ But the children of Israel walked upon dry land in the midst of the sea; and the waters were a wall unto them on their right hand, and on their left. ³⁰ Thus Jehovah saved Israel that day out of the hand of the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead upon the sea-shore. ³¹ And Israel saw the great work which Jehovah did upon the Egyptians, and the people feared Jehovah: and they believed in Jehovah, and in His servant Moses.

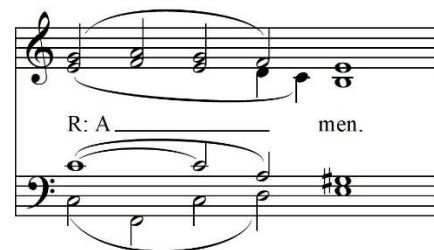

hast executed true judgements: for according to truth and justice hast Thou brought all these things upon us because of our sins. ⁶ For we have sinned and committed iniquity, in departing from Thee. ⁷ In all things have we trespassed, and not obeyed Thy commandments, nor kept them, neither done as Thou hast commanded us, that it might go well with us. ⁸ Wherefore all that Thou hast brought upon us, and everything that Thou hast done to us, Thou hast done in true judgement. ⁹ And Thou didst deliver us into the hands of lawless enemies, and most hateful forsakers of God, and to an unjust king, and the most wicked in all the world. ¹⁰ And now we cannot open our mouth; shame and reproach have befallen Thy servants, and them that worship Thee. ¹¹ Deliver us not up utterly, for Thy name's sake, neither disannul Thou Thy covenant: ¹² and cause not Thy mercy to depart from us, for the sake of Abraham that is beloved of Thee, and for the sake of Isaac Thy servant, and Israel Thy holy one; ¹³ to whom Thou didst promise, that Thou wouldest multiply their seed as the stars of heaven, and as the sand that is upon the sea shore. ¹⁴ For we, O Lord, are become less than any nation, and be kept under this day in all the world because of our sins. ¹⁵ Neither is there at this time prince, or prophet, or leader, or burnt offering, or sacrifice, or oblation, or incense, or place to offer before Thee, and to find mercy. ¹⁶ Nevertheless in a contrite heart and a humble spirit let us be accepted; ¹⁷ like as in the burnt offerings of rams and bullocks, and like as in ten thousands of fat lambs; so let our sacrifice be in Thy sight this day, and *grant* that we may wholly go after Thee, for they shall not be ashamed that put their trust in Thee. ¹⁸ And now we follow Thee with all our heart, we fear Thee, and seek Thy face. ¹⁹ Put us not to shame: but deal with us after Thy kindness, and according to the multitude of Thy mercy. ²⁰ Deliver us also according to Thy marvellous works, and give glory to Thy name, O Lord: and let all them that do Thy servants hurt be confounded; ²¹ and let them be ashamed of all their power and might, and let their strength be broken; ²² and let them know that Thou art the Lord, the only God, and glorious over the whole world." ²³ And the king's servants, that put them in, ceased not to make the furnace hot with naphtha, pitch, tow, and small wood; ²⁴ so that the flame streamed forth above the furnace forty and nine cubits. ²⁵ And it spread, and burned those Chaldeans whom it found about the furnace. ²⁶ But the angel of the Lord came down into the furnace together with Azarias and his fellows, and he smote the flame of the fire out of the furnace; ²⁷ and made the midst of the furnace as it had been a moist whistling wind, so that the fire touched them not at all, neither hurt nor troubled them. ²⁸ Then the three, as out of one
