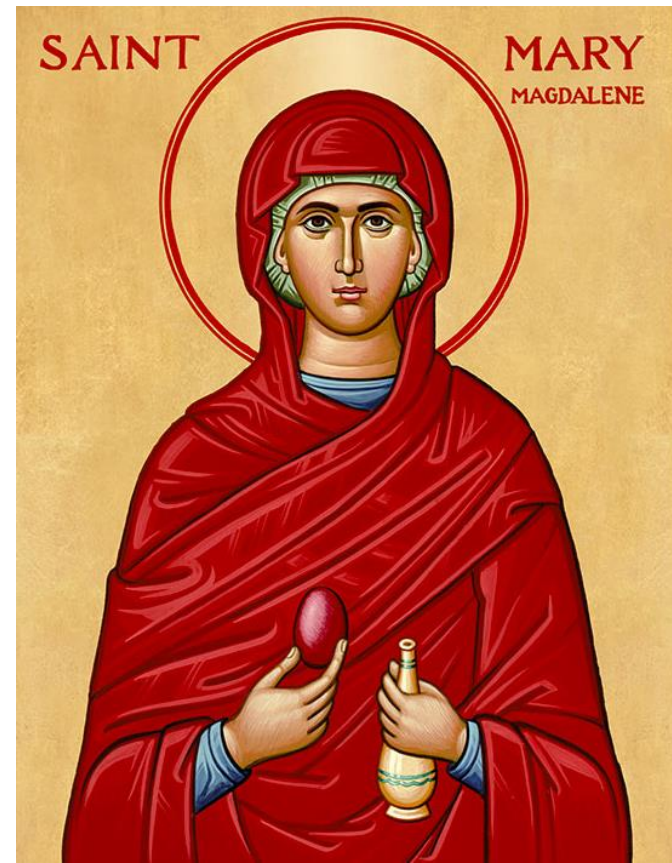
**A Prayer after Communion**



and Earth


and of all things visible

came down from Heaven


And was incarnate by the Holy

+ And was made man;


And was crucified also for us

judge both the quick and the dead;




Whose kingdom shall have no end.

the Son,




Who with the Father and the Son together
