Members of other Lutheran parishes or other denominations are kindly asked to refrain from communing today. The Pastor would be glad to make an appointment with anyone to discuss our teachings and/or our parish.

A Prayer before Communion



An Excerpt from Luther's Writings

"The third requisite of true prayer is, that one must name definitely something that he brings to God or for which he prays; as for strong faith, for love, for peace, and for the comfort of his neighbor. One must actually set forth the petitions; just as the Lord's Prayer presents seven petitions. This is what Christ means by the words: 'If ye shall ask anything of the Father.' 'Anything,' that is, whatever you are in need of. Besides, He Himself interprets this 'anything' and says: 'That your joy may be made full.' That is, pray for all things you need, until you have acquired even all and your joy is made full; and His prayer will first be fully answered on the day of judgment." From Martin Luther's Sermon in the Church Postil for Rogate Sunday.
